


Good intentions in exams

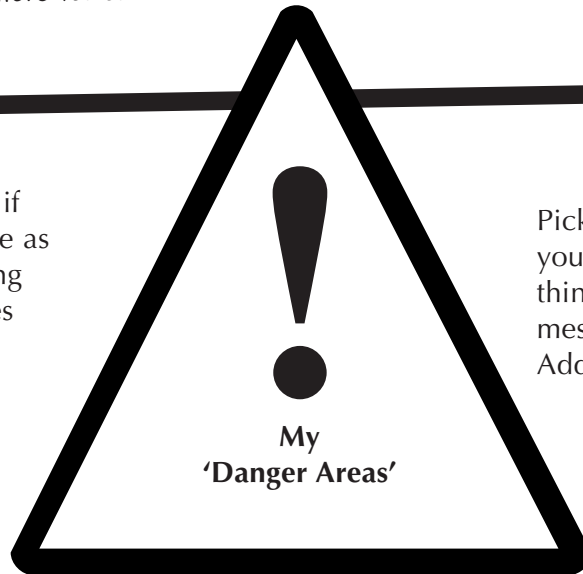
Let's get it right in the exams. Read each statement below and place a tick in **all** of the boxes.



I will

1. Answer the question that is written and not the question I think is written
2. Write the answer in the form required for each individual exam
3. Give all questions appropriate time and not leave just two minutes for the last question
4. Note carefully the number of questions I have to answer
5. Show my understanding of specialist terms by defining them and giving examples
6. Select relevant evidence to back up my points and not try to put all I know into the answer
7. Show I understood technical terms
8. Make sure I know the meaning of key exam instructions such as 'discuss' and 'explain'
9. Read through my answers for errors
10. Do well
